And from and immediately after her decease, I have
and frequently after my said Debts, Expenses, Expenses
and probate of this my Will, and paid and satisfied
all and singular my said personal Estate, and I have
unto Gregory and Emanuel my share in equal shares
and proportions; But my Will is that in case either of
my said share shall happen to dye in the life time of
my said Wife that the share or part of my said
personal Estate given to either of my said share as
aforesaid shall be at the sole disposal of my said Wife
and her heirs, heirs, assigns, executors, Administrators
and appointees, she or he, both my said Wife, to be Executors
